## Keeping you updated

We wanted to provide you with an update on the development and what you can expect from us over the coming months.

#### Overview

- A total of 620 homes to include private and affordable homes of mixed tenure and there is 131 homes on the bovis phase with no affordable
- There is a NEAP (Neighbourhood area of play) Opening Jan 2028
- Trim trail has been installed
- Attenuation basin some are in and some are yet to be completed
- Solar panels for all homes that fall under the 2021 building regulations (These are homes that were started after June 2023)

#### Site activity

- Bulk earthworks to be completed across the remainder of the site
- Main spine road and a small percentage of secondary roads have been completed. Other roads will be constructed in advance of when adjacent homes are being constructed
- Noise bund between proposed woodside development and Stoneleigh view on Broadgate, is under construction, finish date TBC

We are working closely with Warwickshire County highways. The start date is yet to be confirmed

### How will the development benefit the local community?

Bovis homes will also support the local community by contributing over £1,242,217 towards:

- Bus service contribution £806
- Bus stop contribution £52,000
- Education £10,188.43 per dwelling (not to exceed £6,316,822)
- Highways £5047.80 per dwelling Indoor sports £1,164.54 per dwelling (not to exceed £722,014)
- Library £21.89 per dwelling
- Monitoring £29,730 council and £2,400 county council.
- Multi use games contribution £65,500
- South Warwickshire NHS trust £554,918.50
- Police infrastructure contribution £130,959
- 15Safer routes to school £15.000
- Secondary education land purchase £221,428
- Secondary school forward funding interest contribution £157,089
